The aim of SAFE is to work alongside parents to maintain and further develop their parenting skills, improving the likelihood of maintaining the family unit.

SAFE workers develop partnerships with families to support them through the developmental milestones of their children's development. The program operates across metropolitan and regional Adelaide.

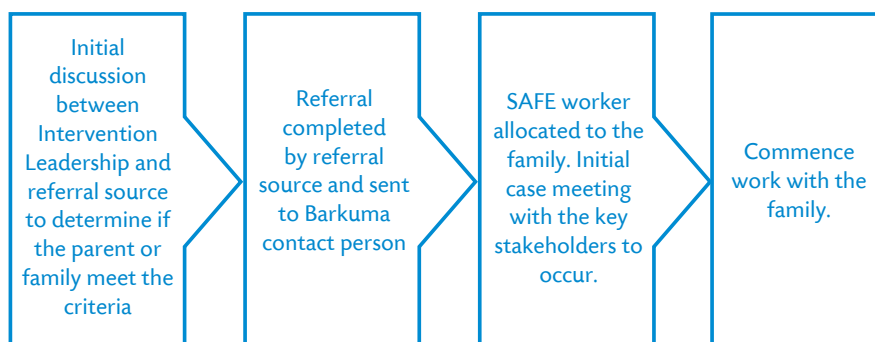
Examples of support provided

- Use a Developmental Milestone basis for planning.
- Provide practical 1 on 1 support and mentoring.
- Support referral of client to other appropriate services.

Practical support examples

- Demonstrating SAFE sleep techniques.
- Role modeling age appropriate play and reading to a child.
- Reading a child's cues.
- Attending medical appointments. Supporting parent to comprehend information given and implement any directions.
